

### GOSPEL MEDITATION

### **DEEPEN YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**

Once a man came to the Vatican and asked to see Pope John Paul II, claiming that they had been friends in Poland. When told of the man, the Pope said, "He is mistaken about our friendship. I don't recall ever having suffered with him." As it turned out, the man had never known the Pope. Now, I'm not sure if the story is totally factual. But doesn't the juxtaposition of *suffering* with *friendship* sound exactly like JPII? He understood that the deepest and most lasting friendships are forged in the fires of shared suffering. No suffering, no friendship. Amazing.

This week we hear Jesus say to the apostles and to us, "You are my friends if you do what I command you" (John 15:14). In Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, God entered the world of human suffering and transformed it into an avenue of friendship with Himself. Following His command — to love, to lay down our lives for others — will always entail suffering. But this suffering only deepens our friendship with Him. His suffering is ours; ours is His. We have become friends of God.

This week, how might you share your suffering with the Risen Jesus? How might he be sharing his suffering with you, in the lives of those around you? Be attentive to that, and you'll find that you are indeed a friend of God, because you've suffered together a great deal.



Think about your life for a moment: all that you hope and dream for, the things that fill the minutes and hours of your days, the challenges, joys, and everything in between. Then, remember that in each of those times, in all of the yearning and wondering, ups and downs, ins and outs, the Holy Spirit is with you. Always and everywhere.

It may be easy to lose sight of the Holy Spirit. Unless we are attentive to God's continual offer of grace, we may feel that we are left to face the circumstances of our lives alone. The celebration of Pentecost reminds us that we have been imbued with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, special ways in which the Spirit is present. The gifts are already given; we must be ready to recognize and allow the Spirit to activate them within us when we need them, and in doing so, we will powerfully know the Spirit's presence.

Confused or facing a difficult decision? Ask the Spirit to provide wisdom. When uncertain or befuddled by the complexity of life around you, understanding awaits. When seeking God's will in demanding situations, ask the Spirit to give you knowledge. When you or a friend face a moral or ethical dilemma, rely on the Spirit's counsel. Feeling weak and wavering in your commitment to live as a disciple of Jesus? Ask the Holy Spirit for fortitude. Seeking meaning and purpose in life and faith? Ask for piety - reverence for God and God's ways. Need to see beyond the mundane and understand yourself as a child of God? Invite the Holy Spirit to imbue you with fear of the Lord holy awe.

The Holy Spirit knows our hearts and is already at work within us. The Holy Spirit is love. Love resides within us, awaiting our readiness to live in love boldly, compassionately, trusting that our good God will give us all we need.

# We live in mission through the Holy Spirit

Have you ever felt it just isn't possible to live as a disciple in today's world?

There is no doubt, living faith in our daily lives is not always easy. Not only is the world increasingly ambivalent about, sometimes overtly hostile to, faith, it is challenging to consciously live as a follower of Jesus. Doing so requires us to be intentional about our attitudes, decisions, and actions, every day, in every situation.

We are sometimes uncertain whether we are ready to take our relationship with Christ seriously.

It isn't that life is always hard, although we all have difficult periods in our lives. It is simply that living as a Christian raises expectations about the way we should live.

Sometimes it feels as though we're hitting a wall, and are tempted to take the easy way out.

Friends may want us to do things that feel counter to the Christian way of life. We may face ethical dilemmas at work. We may fight selfish and self-centered tendencies when demands are placed on our time. We may be afraid to truly live as a person of faith, for fear of rejection or ridicule.

After Jesus' crucifixion, the disciples were filled with fear.

They likely felt they had hit a wall. They remained together, waiting as Jesus had told them, uncertain of what was to come.

On the day of Pentecost, they were filled with the Holy Spirit.

Empowered with the strength and courage of the Spirit of God, they they boldly shared the good news of Jesus' resurrection and they never looked back.

Like the disciples, we, too, have a mission. And like them, the Holy Spirit is with us.

In his pastoral exhortation on the call to holiness in today's world, Pope Francis challenges us to live our mission with purpose through the power of the Holy Spirit: "You too need to see the entirety of your life as a mission. Try to do so by listening to God in prayer and recognizing the signs that he gives you. Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its place in the mission you have received. Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world." (GE, 23).

# IMPACT THIS MONTH

### **BE QUIET**

Find a place and time for quiet at the end of each day or week.

### **BE ATTENTIVE**

Pay attention when you feel the presence of the Holy Spirit or when you especially need to know God's love.

### **BE OPEN**

Be open to the actions, attitudes, sacrifice, or service to which you may be called.

IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER, AND OF THE SON, AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT.

We begin and end prayer with the Sign of the Cross, but have you ever thought of the sign itself as a prayer?

The Sign of the Cross invites us into an encounter with God's love, protection, mercy, forgiveness and presence. Through this briefest of prayers, we recall the key mysteries of our faith: that we are created in love and for love by God the Father; we are redeemed through Jesus Christ, whose passion, death, and resurrection lead us to the fullness of life; and we are filled with the Holy

Spirit, whose presence empowers us to live as God desires.

These three persons of the Holy Trinity are one God, whose love is overflowing, everlasting, abundant beyond

our comprehension.

The Sign of the Cross is a sign of our faith, whether prayed privately in personal prayer or publicly, before meals, at Mass, with friends.

The next time you make the Sign of the Cross, make a renewed commitment to live as a child of God, disciple of Jesus Christ, as one

who is anointed and sealed with the Holy Spirit. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen!

### DISCERNMENT OF NEW MEMBERS FOR UNIFIED PASTORAL COUNCIL

ST. ISIDORE, THE FATHER, FAMILY OF PARISHES

We are asking for those of you who are interested or know someone who would be a great addition to the Unified Pastoral Council to send in nominations. These individuals will have the opportunity to learn more about the role of a member and to sit in on a meeting to help the discernment process. Please send nominations to <a href="mailto:mfent@celina-ic.org">mfent@celina-ic.org</a>.

#### a. NOMINATION

There shall be a minimum of five members discerned each year to replace the five members finishing their third year, therefore keeping the Family Council membership at 15 members. The Council shall maintain a gender balance, and at no time falling below a four to two balance. Nominations for new members shall even the balance, if necessary.

- **b. DISCERNMENT**—the nominations will occur in May. In June through a discernment process the candidate will be offered the opportunity to learn more about the pastoral council so that they can make an informed decision on being a member of the council. Discernment meeting details are as follows:
- 1) Opening prayer and introductions
- 2) Welcome and congratulations
- 3) This meeting is to begin a discernment process for being an active member of pastoral council. The evening dialog is a prayerful way for the group to call upon the Holy Spirit for guidance. Our hope is that this selection by discernment allows for all involved to find a place to be actively involved in service to the Family whether that be on pastoral council, the finance council, the worship commission or in some other important parish ministry.
- 4) We will look at the expectations of council members, meeting schedules, typical meeting agendas and a look at the next steps. You will have an opportunity to discuss your thoughts and feelings as well as ask questions.
- 5) Overview of the purpose and functions of a pastoral council;

Archdiocesan guidelines (the five challenges)
The experience of council members
Meeting schedules

- 6) Typical agenda items for the pastoral council meeting
- 7) Overview of parish programs/current parish priorities. All of the Family's programs and ministries are listed and described in the annual parish directory.
- 8) Explanation of next steps: brief explanation of discernment evening and communicate with the pastor interest in moving to the next steps
- 9) Second reading
- 10) Introduction of participants in the discernment process
  - A) Current involvement
  - B) Hopes for being a member of pastoral council
  - C) What gifts and interests do you bring
- 11) Dialog among participants—you are invited to comment on what you heard and make observations about what others bring to pastoral council. The comments can affirm what others have said.
- 12) Final discernment (yes/no/other ministries/need time to consider)
- 13) Next steps
- 14) Final prayer
