

GOSPEL MEDITATION **DEEPEN YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE**


A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do *you* get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Question:

Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers — the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world.

Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind with experience in the years to come."





April: Elizabeth's Burden



Relevant Scripture: Luke 1: 5-17

Old Elizabeth's burden was a quiet one. She always carried herself with a confidence and dignity that was fitting to the wife of a high priest. She had been beautiful as a young women and even more so as she reached the late years of life. Zechariah always referred to her as the greatest joy in his life, and he meant it no doubt. He knew these things were complicated and never blamed her in the least. Still, she would wrongly blame herself. When she would find herself alone in their home, her pain would often strike her as sharp as knife. Even now, as her friends celebrated grandchildren, the pain of her barrenness could be so intense as to leave her teary-eyed and breathless at times.

Zechariah and Elizabeth were truly pillars in their community. Likewise, they had worked hard to nurture an environment of deep love, commitment, and kindness in their home. Why had the Lord not blessed them with just one son or daughter upon which to shower so much love? And if that could not be an option, why could He not at least let the desire of her heart begin to wane? Why could this piercing not be softened by the many other blessings in her life?

Of course, Elizabeth knew well the derision with which the younger mothers sometimes spoke of her. She could see behind the silly facades of women half her age who thought they were too superior to even associate with a barren womanz These did not bother herz There was even something comical about their absurdityz Nozwhat hurt the most was her knowledge that children were being born in every corner of the world. Many were even being neglected or abandoned. Yet, she and her dear husband were being denied this most basic of human longings, the desire for a child of their own to love and raise according to the law of Moses.

Then, that strange morning came when Zechariah lost his voice. She would have thought he might be distraught to lose something so important to his daily life. Yet, he seemed completely unconcerned, almost joyful. What did he know? What secret was it that he could no longer share with her? Weeks later, she felt something strange inside her, a bubbliness or a tickle. She knew it was madness. She knew it was impossible, and yet somehow, she also knew beyond any shadow of doubt that the Lord had finally blessed them. She chuckled to herself. Old Elizabeth was finally going to be a mother!

Over the next month please pray especially for all those couples who struggle with the heavy burden of infertility. May Christ free them from their grief while also leading them to fertility practices fully in line with their own dignity and the dignity of their potential offspring.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

EYE HAS NOT SEEN

They say seeing is believing. But if you've ever ordered a pair of pants online, you know that's not always the case. Whatever the photos promise us, what looked like a perfectly nice shade of navy blue on our computer screens comes in the mail as an unusual shade of blue green that only appears in the giant box of Crayola crayons.

The Apostle Thomas, who couldn't bring himself to accept that Jesus had risen from the dead without seeing him, is such an utterly relatable figure in the Gospels. Thomas is still reeling from a loss — not only of his good friend but his Lord, who was taken prisoner and crucified before his eyes. Thomas is guarding himself. He's not believing the hype. He's going to be the only judge of what is real and what is fiction.

Would any of us be any different? We've all had those thoughts. Can we believe it all — Jesus, salvation history, the Eucharist — when we haven't seen it with our own two eyes?

That's when we need to remember that those two eyes were absolutely positive they had ordered a pair of navy blue pants.

It's easy for us to sit back stroking our chins in judgment at Thomas, "you didn't believe the testimony of your friends!" But do we accept the testimony of our friends? The saints, the popes, the Church fathers themselves?

Sometimes the things that are most worthy of believing can't be seen with the naked eye.

SCHOLARSHIP DONATION CREDIT

MONETARY DONATIONS

Individual taxpayers and pass-through entities can claim a credit for monetary donations made to an eligible scholarship granting organization (SGO). The credit equals the lesser of \$750 or the total amount donated to SGO's during the tax year. If you are filing a joint return and both you and your spouse make eligible donations, each of you can claim this credit (up to \$1500 total). Beginning in tax year 2023, the credit may also be claimed donations made on or before the un-extended return due date, but the same contribution cannot be used to claim the credit in two tax years.




